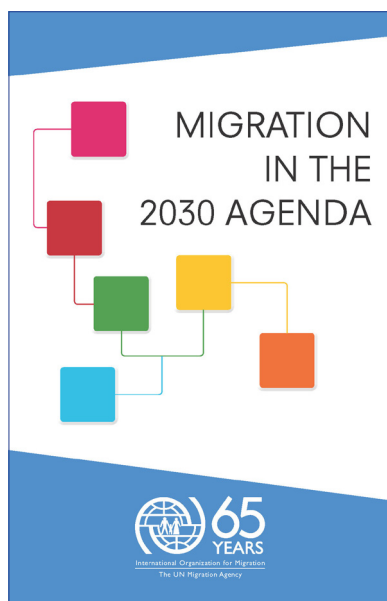


# LAUNCH EVENT OF IOM PUBLICATION: “MIGRATION IN THE 2030 AGENDA”

The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development – with its complex framework of 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) – was adopted in September 2015, and for the first time migration was included in the mainstream global development policy. Since then, IOM has worked with its Member States and partners to raise awareness and develop their understanding of how migration is reflected in the 2030 Agenda, and how it can serve as an accelerator to achieve all 17 SDGs.

In this endeavor, IOM is pleased to launch its publication “Migration in the 2030 Agenda”, and raise awareness on how the following themes are addressed in the 2030 Agenda: Diaspora engagement, environment and climate change, health, gender equality, labour mobility, role of cities, displacement and child rights. This publication, with its compendium of nine articles, demonstrates how migration fits in the various goals and targets of the 2030 Agenda, while also highlighting some of the complex challenges and opportunities which accompany the migration-related targets.
